Welcome back to the beginning of another term.

Being at School on Time

I would like to ask parents to make every effort to have their students at school between 8.20-8.40am. Students coming to school before 8.20am can be waiting some time before teachers are in their class and students arriving after 8.40am are rushing to have themselves organised and ready for the day.
