These colourful Easter Eggs were coloured by our Room 3 P-1 students who systematically covered the egg with a coat of wax which was worked to reveal the areas to receive the first colour. After the first colour had been applied and dried the initial wax was added to with a new coat that would permit the second pattern of colour to be applied and so on.

The general tradition of painting eggs predates the Christian celebration of Easter and can possibly be detected in Ancient Persian traditions as well as others.

Many societies have different traditions regarding eggs at Easter. Egg rolling is a traditional Easter Egg game played with eggs at Easter.
