COP TO CRUSADER

Q. Who is Paul Litherland & why is he on the march to make Surf Online Safe the best it can be?

From 2009 to 2014, I was working within the Technology Crime Investigation Unit of the Western Australia Police. A division of Computer Crime, we dealt with issues ranging from people being ripped off on Ebay and Gumtree, to Romance Scams and Hacking, right up to kids being approached online by predators. It was a massive world of which even I did not realise was so out of control.

The last few years of my career, I became increasingly frustrated with the lack of legislation and authority I had as a Police Officer to act on the concerns of the parents and educators who were contacting my office on a daily basis. The vast majority of these calls were ended with the simple phrase, "Sorry, but it is not against the law." It was upsetting to respond in this way, but in reality, I had no choice. The internet has been around since 1994 in this country and yet legislation has failed (or refused) to catch up. As such, many schools, parents and kids themselves are being left to deal with such matters on their own. I simply felt this was unacceptable.

By 2013, in addition to pressing our government for change, I decided that education was a better approach. I felt that if I could get my message out to as many schools as possible, the risks our kids are being exposed to every day, would hopefully reduce. I soon started presenting to 5 schools in my local community and Surf Online Safe was born. Over the past 5 years, Surf Online Safe has grown amazingly and I am now presenting to over 300 schools and organisations across Perth, including some of WA's most prestigious colleges.

Last year, over 65 thousand students, parents and educators had seen an SOS presentation. So my message is getting to more and more kids each year and I am proud of that. The demand for my presentations has increased dramatically across WA and I look forward to becoming part of your school community.

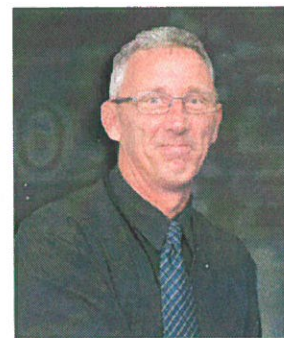
